

Studies on positive effects of standards

- ISO Studies on economic benefits of standards
 - the combined effect of quality management standards and production/testing standards leads to a <u>stable and sustainable increase in production</u>
 - the contribution of the standard to the total profit of the company varies from 0.15 - 5.0% of the total annual sales revenue
 - environmental benefits application of the ISO 14000 standard, saving waste disposal costs,.....
 - better control of incoming raw materials and final products
 - savings in the procurement of raw materials (up to 30%), if standardized raw materials are procured
 - optimization of design time (engineering) and reduction of product placement time

Studies on positive effects of standards

- EC funded project on "Functions and Effects of Standards"
 - <u>SMEs are mostly present upstream materials and components</u>
 - SMEs presence downstream transport, retail, services associated with products (installation, maintenance, repair, etc).
 - SMEs and especially micro-enterprises do not always play a leading role in developing standards and find it extremely difficult to get involved in standardisation processes.



ISS Study on effects of standards

- a total of 197 respondents filled out the questionnaire
- Besides MSS, the most frequently used are standards for products (52.9%) and testing (50.6%),
- 1/3 use standards for services and processes (around 34%)
- 53% standards had an effect on increasing production and sales
- 34.01% standards improve the delivery of products and services, and
- 28.43% of organizations believe that standards simplify the procurement process
- standards development crucial for larger companies (anticipate the potential market, develop and maintain strong industrial networks)






Institutional framework for Quality Infrastructure in Serbia


CCIS services – Technical regulations and standards

- Knowledge base: CE mark passport for products
 - "CE mark" Portal
 - On-line application "Product safety check"
 - e-Guides and e-Brochures
- Promotion of the application of standards and standardization in business
 - free of charge searching and reading of EN SRPS standards in the premises of the 6 Regional CCI (Subotica, Novi Sad, Valjevo, Kragujevac, Zaječar, Niš)
- Training activities for MSME "How to get the CE mark or Serbian conformity mark" are continuously carried out
- Professional advice and support to members how to prepare for the placement of products on the domestic and Single market



CCIS services – CE marking application

- Methodology limitations and challenges:
 - Dual system: "single (EU) market" and "domestic market"
 - Availability of documents, regulations all in one place!
 - Suitability for end-user
 - Balance between simplicity and level of detail






CCIS services – CE marking application

- Development of online application (partnership with WKO, ADA):
 - Questionnaire for the Machinery Safety Directive/Regulation
 - min. 31, max. 43 questions filling in takes about 10 minutes!
 - Also "covered" all other new approach directives (24)
 - As a result, an integral REPORT is generated









CCIS services – CE marking application

- The REPORT contains:
 - a list of directives potentially applicable to a given product
 - links to texts of directives or Serbian regulations
 - links to the list of harmonized (SRPS) standards ",called" by these directives
 - list of notified/designated bodies for conformity assessment
 - contacts of competent authorities
- If the Machinery Directive applies, it is possible to go all the way - check the conformity assessment procedure













CCIS services – Promotion of standards in businesses

- Awareness raising on Standards (Project "EU for Serbia – Support for safer products"):
 - raising awareness on the importance of standards implementation
 - focusing communication on benefits for business and civil society
 - promotion of info-centers for standards in CCIS-RCC
 - promotion of the work in ISS National Technical Committees
- More then 120 participants in 6 cities (Subotica, Novi Sad, Valjevo, Kragujevac, Zaječar i Niš)


Economic benefits:



Standards available to SMEs in Serbian language


During 2021, almost 300 pages were translated from English to Serbian:

- SRPS EN ISO 14090:2019 Adaptation to climate change Principles, requirements and guidelines (69 pages),
- 2) <u>SRPS EN ISO 14052:2019</u> Environmental management Material Flow-cost accounting Guidance for practical application in the supply chain (36 p.),
- 3) <u>SRPS EN ISO 14067:2019</u> Greenhouse gases Carbon footprint of products Requirements and guidelines for quantification (109 p.) and
- 4) SRPS EN ISO 14050:2020 Environmental management Glossary (83 p.)



- National CSR Award "Đorđe Vajfert":
 - Conducted every second year (since 2007.);
 - More than 500 companies passed 8 awarding processes;
 - Methodology, transparency and multisector approach;
 - 3 categories: micro/small, medium and large companies;
 - On-site verification audit
 - Jury members: 3 Ministries (economy; environment; labor/social), 1 University; 1 CCO/NGO; 1 Media and 1 CCIS
- Council for CSR
 - Established in 2016. as multisectorial, consultation body for dialogue and CSR promotion;
 - 25 members (12 companies; 10 foundations and NGOs; 2 business associations; one ministry);
 - Promotion of CSR activities and best practices;
 - Promotion and education of members on nonfinancial reporting and other CSR initiatives.
